




That in January 2022 the Forum worked closely with an agency called Contact to appoint new forum officers to improve communications and engagement within the community. Let us know how we are doing






That in most areas of England a Forum works with service leaders to develop Co-Production, which means working with a Forum as an equal partner & listening to what they and their community say






Parent carers from all different Bristol communities access our coffee mornings.

Everyone is welcome & we try to offer support for families that don't speak English = \(\) =




That if your child has an Education Health and Care plan and they are moving to secondary school in September 2023, their Plan should have been reviewed by now, ready for the transition period.


DID YOU KNOW?




That the Forum is usually funded by the Department for Education but this is not the case in Bristol. This means the Bristol SEND community is missing out on support & funding that a parent carer forum would usually offer. We are working hard to change that, please bear with us while we find other funding sources.



A parent carer forum is a totally independent organisation - it is independent of the local authority (Bristol City Council) and local health services. This is important so that parent carer views can be presented without bias.




Across England, parent carer forums listen to what families say about services & share this with Education, Health and Social care managers. This ensures parent carer feedback is at the heart of any changes made.




In some areas across England, parent carer feedback is not used effectively. This often means services don't work as well for families as they perhaps could.

This can lead to frustration for families and complaints about services which increases the workload of SEND service staff.

Working together as a team provides better services for families & more productive staff workloads.




Bristol Parent Carers works closely with health services to shape local services & ensure they deliver the right support at the right time & in the right way for families.




We host coffee mornings in schools with parents & school staff. We make sure families know all about the support available from local organisations & charities, ask your school to book one today.








There is also a service available called FLORA? It is a team of people that you or your school can call for help & advice on any area of SEND you need. From forms to clubs, give them a call.






There is a team that you can call to access support to enable you to have some time away from your disabled child or children. Whether it's 30 minutes or overnight, give them a call.






Usually, a parent carer forum is funded by the Department for Education (DfE). Only one Forum can apply for & receive the funding & it can not be split between groups. In 2023 we are hoping to access the DfE funding to work with other organisations & improve SEND support in Bristol.










Every other month, we run a different survey where we ask you to take two minutes to tell us something. check out this months survey and you could win a £20 high street voucher.
