These are funded from the school budget which varies at each school. Your child may have a target plan to help monitor this support. Reasonable adjustments should also be in place</p>	<p></p> <p>School may refer your child to external services such as an educational psychologist. If they don't have funds for this, they should ask the council for support via a Support Plan or EHC needs assessment</p>	<p></p> <p>£</p> <p>This is designed to support children and young people with emerging needs to be supported by Ordinarily Available Provision. The funding of £500 is intended to provide early support</p>	<p></p> <p>£</p> <p>This is a statutory plan detailing support & provisions specific to a pupil's needs. Professionals, schools, families & pupils create the plan & the support is funded by the local council</p>
